The 419th Fighter Wing at Hill Air Force Base is Utah's premier Air Force Reserve unit. We offer a diverse range of combat capability to include operations and maintenance on the Air Force's newest fighter jet, the F-35 Lightning II. We also have a full-spectrum mission support group to include civil engineering, security forces, medical, aerial port, firefighting, supply, and transportation. The 419th is made up of nearly 1,300 personnel, most of whom are "Citizen Airmen" who serve part time in the military but are full-time members of the local community. Most of our personnel live, work, and raise families in Northern Utah.
